Missoula County to Host National Voter Registration Day Election Workshops

Tuesday, September 26 marks National Voter Registration Day. The Missoula County Elections Office is celebrating this event by hosting election education workshops to all voters of all ages. All workshops are free and open to both the public and members of the media.

“At Missoula County, we continue to expand transparency in elections,” Elections Administrator, Rebecca Connors said. “These election education workshops are the first of their kind and serve as a window to the inner workings of our office.”

“Being an informed voter is critical to navigating through election processes. These informational sessions will help voters understand the complexities of the law and be able to set themselves up for positive voting experiences.

At 10 a.m. and 2 p.m., the Elections Office will host workshops at the Fairgrounds. Attendees will gain in-depth information regarding voter registration, election security, rejected ballots, voter list maintenance, and more. Each session is expected to run two hours.

At 11 a.m., 12 p.m. and 1 p.m., the Elections Office will host election education workshops on campus for students. These workshops will help students understand the ins and outs of registering to vote, as well as important considerations such as why your signature matters and why it's important to maintain an updated address with the Elections Office. Students can drop in at any time. Workshops will be 20 minutes in length and County staff are available following the presentations to provide one-on-one assistance to student voters.
