RESOLUTION NO. 12212017

RESOLUTION OF THE SEELEY LAKE-MISSOULA COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT; APPROVING LEVIES OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS WITHIN THE DISTRICT FOR THE PURPOSE OF REPAYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENT BONDS TO BE ISSUED TO FINANCE CERTAIN LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS CONSISTING OF THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, AND INSTALLATION OF A SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT AND SEWER COLLECTION LINES AND ASSOCIATED IMPROVEMENTS AND APPURTENANCES, SOME OF WHICH BENEFIT ALL OF THE PROPERTY IN THE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Seeley Lake-Missoula County Sewer District, Montana (the "District") is a county sewer district, validly organized pursuant to Title 7, Chapter 13, Parts 22 and 23, Montana Code Annotated (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the District was incorporated on June 18, 1992 and is located within the boundaries of Missoula County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 09072016 A, adopted by the Board of Directors of the District (the "Board") on September 7, 2016, the District, following a public hearing, created four (4) separate subdistricts, denominated as "Subdistrict No. 1," "Subdistrict No. 2," "Subdistrict No. 3," and "Subdistrict No. 4;" and

WHEREAS, the District proposes to design, construct, and install a sewer system for the benefit of the entire District and the surrounding Seeley Lake community, including the design, construction, and installation of a sewage treatment plant, force mains and lift stations, sewer collection lines, service connections, and other appurtenances (collectively, the "Improvements") to establish or make available sewer service to properties in and around the District; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors (the "Board") of the District has determined that it is in the best interests of the District to construct the portion of the Improvements consisting of the collection system in phases; and

WHEREAS, the Board proposes to undertake an initial project consisting of (i) construction and installation of the sewage treatment plant sized to serve all of the properties in the District and surrounding areas and associated appurtenances that benefit all properties in the District, including a force main and lift station (such plant and appurtenances, the "Sewage Treatment Plant"), and (ii) construction and installation of collection lines and a lift station connecting sewer services to properties in Subdistrict No. 1, associated rights-of-way and easements, and abandoning existing septic systems in Subdistrict No. 1 (collectively, the "Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the property in the District located outside of Subdistrict No. 1 will not initially have sewer collection lines extended to it as a result of the combined project consisting of the Sewage Treatment Plant and the Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements (collectively, the "Initial Project"), but will benefit from the construction and availability of the Sewage Treatment Plant; and

WHEREAS, consistent with Section 7-13-2349 of the Act, the Board believes that land in the District will benefit in accordance with its proximity to and ability to be served and benefited by the Sewage Treatment Plant and thus the District should be segregated into subdistricts so that properties within the District may be subjected to assessments now and in the future in proportion to the benefits conferred by the design, construction, and installation of the Initial Project and, over time, the balance of the Improvements; and

WHEREAS, to finance the costs of the proposed Initial Project, the District proposes to issue special assessment bonds in one or more series in an estimated approximate aggregate principal amount of \$5,790,000 (collectively, the "Bonds") to obtain funds for the purpose of paying a portion of the costs of the proposed Initial Project and associated costs; and

WHEREAS, it will be necessary for the District to collect sufficient revenues to repay the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the District and owners of property in the Subdistricts and the users and prospective users of the System to pay the capital costs of the Initial Project through special assessments to be levied in varying amounts and in accordance with benefits conferred against the properties in the District to be benefitted by the Initial Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7-13-2333, M.C.A. and as provided in Sections 7-13-2280 through 7-13-2290 and 7-13-2349, M.C.A., the District is authorized to levy special assessments against property located in the Subdistricts and benefitted by the Initial Project and pledge the collections of the special assessments, in whole or in part, with any other revenue of the District, to the payment of its special assessment bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of the District as follows:

Section 1. Passage of Resolution of Intention. This Board, on November 8, 2017, adopted Resolution No. 11082017 (the "Resolution of Intention"), pursuant to which this Board declared its intention to undertake the Initial Project, generally consisting of the design, construction, and installation of a sewage treatment plant and sewer collection lines and associated improvements and appurtenances, some of which benefit all of the property in the District, and to undertake to authorize special assessments to finance a portion of the cost thereof and incidental thereto through the issuance of special assessment bonds of the District.

Section 2. Notice and Public Hearing. Notice of passage of the Resolution of Intention was duly published and mailed in all respects in accordance with law, and on December 21, 2017, this Board conducted a public hearing on the proposed special assessments. At the hearing, this Board heard and passed on all protests made during the period ended 32 days after the first date of publication of the notice of passage of the Resolution of Intention (the "Protest Period"). The meeting of this Board at which this resolution is adopted is the first regular meeting of the Board following the expiration of the Protest Period.

Section 3. Protests. Within the Protest Period, a total of 189 protests to the levy of special assessments were duly filed. This Board has considered the protests submitted to the proposed special assessments and other comments made at the public hearing. This Board

hereby determines that the assessment of costs of the Initial Project and incidental costs of financing against the properties benefitted thereby as prescribed by the Resolution of Intention is equitable and in proportion to and does not exceed the special benefits derived from the Initial Project by any owner of real property within the District to be assessed therefor, and the special assessments to be levied by this Resolution are in accordance with the methods and do not exceed the amounts prescribed by the Resolution of Intention.

The protests are found to total less than 50% of the costs of the Initial Project to be financed with the Bonds and therefore are insufficient to defeat the proposed method of assessment described in the Resolution of Intention and in the notice of proposed levy of special assessments, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference. The Board further finds, for informational purposes only, that the protests with regard to the Sewage Treatment Plant are less than 50% of the costs of the Sewage Treatment Plant and incidental costs to be financed with the Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds (as defined below), and the protests with regard to the Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements are less than 50% of the costs of the Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements and incidental costs to be financed with the Collection System Bond (as defined below). The Board finds that under Section 7-13-2282, M.C.A., it is authorized to proceed with the assessment methodology and the assessments to pay a portion of the costs of the Initial Project as described in the Resolution of Intention and this Resolution to pay the Bonds.

Section 4. Capital Costs; Assessments.

4.01. Estimated Costs of Capital Improvements. The total estimated cost of the Initial Project, including associated costs of financing, is approximately \$15,654,333. The Bonds of the District that are issued to pay a portion of the costs of the Initial Project are currently estimated to be in three series, one bond in the total principal amount of approximately \$1,488,000 to pay a portion of the cost of the collection system serving Subdistrict No. 1 (the "Collection System Bond") and two bonds in the total principal amounts of approximately \$3,000,000 (the "Series B Bond") and \$1,302,000 (the "Series C Bond"), respectively, to pay a portion of the cost of the Sewage Treatment Plant (collectively, the "Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds"). Costs of the Initial Project in excess of the proposed Bonds are expected to be paid by various grants available to the District in an aggregate amount of \$9,796,333 that will benefit the entire District and funds the District has on hand and available therefor in an amount of \$68,000. The grants available to the District fund a portion of the costs of the Sewage Treatment Plant in order that such plant may serve the entire District.

4.02. Initial Project. The Initial Project is one integrated project that consists of construction and installation of the Sewage Treatment Plant sized to serve the entire District and adjacent properties, construction and installation of collection lines and a lift station providing sewer services to properties in Subdistrict No. 1, associated rights-of-way and easements, abandoning existing septic systems in Subdistrict No. 1, paying engineering, legal, and associated administrative costs, funding a District debt service reserve account, and related improvements and costs. The viability of the Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements depends on the existence of the Sewage Treatment Plant and the viability of the Sewage Treatment Plant depends on the existence of the Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements.

4.03. Property to be Assessed. Those properties within Subdistrict No. 1 will be assessed to pay the debt service on the Collection System Bond issued to finance a portion of the costs of the collection system to be constructed and installed to serve Subdistrict No. 1. The properties in each of Subdistrict No. 1, Subdistrict No. 2, Subdistrict No. 3, and Subdistrict No. 4 will be assessed to pay the debt service on the Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds issued to finance a portion of the costs of the Sewage Treatment Plant that has the capacity to serve the entire District and adjacent areas.

Exhibit B hereto (which is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof) contains a description of each property in the District to be assessed, the name of the owner of such property, if known, the estimated total principal amount of the assessment against each property to be assessed, and the day when semi-annual payments of principal of and interest on the assessment becomes delinquent.

4.04. Assessment Methodology. Each property in Subdistrict No. 1 will be assessed an equal amount per lot, tract, or parcel in respect of the Collection System Bond and each property in Subdistrict No. 1, Subdistrict No. 2, Subdistrict No. 3, and Subdistrict No. 4 will be assessed an equal amount per lot, tract, or parcel in respect of the Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds.

(a) Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements. Each property in Subdistrict No. 1 will be assessed an equal amount based upon the total cost of the Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements and costs incidental thereto to be financed by the Collection System Bond, which are estimated to be \$1,488,000. By spreading this estimated cost equally across each property in Subdistrict No. 1, the total principal amount of the assessment per property in Subdistrict No. 1 for the Collection System Bond is estimated to be \$7,153.85 and as shown on Exhibit B. Using information set forth in the letter of conditions from the United State Department of Agriculture to the District, dated September 11, 2017 (the "Letter of Conditions") and assuming the estimated total semiannual payments of assessments due in connection with the Collection System Bond would be \$30,796.00 (which assumes interest on assessments relating to such bond is 2.75%), the estimated semiannual payments of assessments per each lot, tract, or parcel in Subdistrict No. 1 would be \$148.06, or \$296.12 per year.

(b) Sewage Treatment Plant. Each property in the District will be assessed an equal amount based upon the total cost of the Sewage Treatment Plant and costs incidental thereto to be financed by the Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds, which is estimated to total \$4,302,000. By spreading this estimated cost equally across each property in the District, the total principal amount of the assessment per property in the District is estimated to be \$8,552.69 and as shown on Exhibit B. Using information set forth in the Letter of Conditions and assuming the estimated total semiannual assessments in the District due in connection with the Sewage Treatment Bonds would be \$90,724.00 (which assumes interest on assessments relating to the Series B Bond is 2.75% and on the Series C Bond is 3.125%), the estimated semiannual payments of assessments per each lot, parcel or tract in the District in connection with the Sewage Treatment Bonds would be \$180.37, or \$360.74 per year.

If an increase occurs in the number of properties within the boundaries of the District during the term of the Bonds, the Board will recalculate the amount assessable to each property based on the Subdistrict in the District in which the increase in the number of properties occurs. The recalculation will be further based on the amount of the outstanding principal of and interest on the Collection System Bond, if applicable, and the Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds for the fiscal year and the District will spread the assessments across the District, and if appropriate, Subdistrict No. 1, based on the number of benefited properties within the boundaries of the District, and if appropriate, Subdistrict No. 1, as of the July 1 following the action that resulted in the increase in the number of properties.

From and after the date of this resolution, the lien of the special assessments to pay or finance a portion of the costs of the Initial Project and incidental costs is not extinguished or diminished by the combination or consolidation of multiple properties into fewer properties; accordingly, the area consisting of the combined or consolidated properties will be assessed in an amount equal to the amount it would have been assessed had the combination or consolidation of properties not occurred.

4.04. Assessment Methodology Equitable and Consistent with Benefit. Pursuant to the Resolution of Intention, which constituted the preliminary resolution setting forth its intention to levy special assessments within the District, this Board determined to levy special assessments to pay the costs of the Initial Project on the basis or bases therein provided as authorized by the Act.

Section 5. Levy of Assessments. The special assessments for the costs of the Initial Project shall be levied and assessed against all lots, tracts, and parcels in the District in accordance with the method of assessments referred to in Section 4.04. Such assessments shall be payable over a term not exceeding 40 years, each in equal semiannual installments of principal, plus interest, or substantially equal semiannual payments of principal and interest, as this Board shall prescribe in the resolution authorizing the issuance of the Bonds. Property owners have the right to prepay assessments as provided by law. Assessments collected in excess of amounts then owing on the Bonds will be applied to prepay the Bonds.

Exhibit B to this Resolution (which is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof) contains, as of the date hereof, a description of each property in the District to be assessed, the name of the owner of such property, if known, the estimated total principal amount of the assessment against each property to be assessed, and the day when semi-annual payments of principal of and interest on the assessment becomes delinquent (the "Assessment Roll").

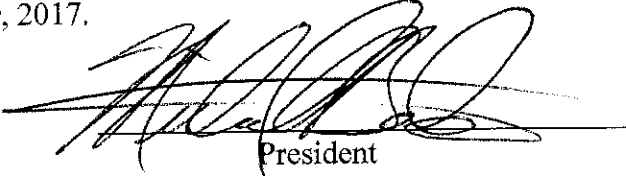
Section 6. Certification of Assessments. A copy of this resolution, including Exhibits A and B hereto, certified by the Secretary shall be delivered to the County Clerk and Recorder within two days after the adoption hereof.

Section 7. Further Actions. Officers of the District and the County are further authorized and directed to take all actions as may be required by law to assure that the special assessments levied by this resolution are duly certified, assessed and collected in accordance with law.

Section 8. Timing of Initial Special Assessments; Subsequent Resolution. Passage of this resolution is necessary for the District to commence work on the Initial Project in earnest

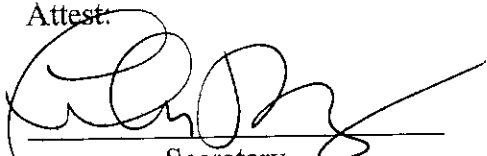
because in the absence of the authority to levy special assessments, the funding agency that will purchase the Bonds lacks the assurances it needs to commit to provide financing. With the authority to levy special assessments, the District can instruct its engineer to perform complete design services for the Initial Project and to prepare bid packages for the construction of the Initial Project, which design work will take months. Construction of the Initial Project will take more than one year and could take more than two years. In addition, because of the requirements of the funding agency, interim financing in the form of one or more series of bond anticipation notes is expected to be required. Because one or more series of the Bonds may not be issued until substantial completion of the Initial Project, the initial levy of the special assessments authorized hereby may not be made on the tax rolls for approximately two or three years. By this Resolution, the Board is authorized to levy the special assessments as and when needed to pay debt service on the Bonds in accordance with this Resolution; provided, however, the actual levy of assessments to pay debt service on the Bonds will be made pursuant to a subsequent resolution when the form, amounts, and details of the Bonds are known, at which time the details of the assessments, including, without limitation, the interest rate thereon, will be fixed.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED LEVY OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS
IN SEELEY LAKE-MISSOULA COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT, MONTANA

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on November 8, 2017, the Board of Directors (the "Board") of the Seeley Lake-Missoula County Sewer District, Montana (the "District"), adopted Resolution No. 11082017, entitled "Resolution of the Seeley Lake-Missoula County Sewer District, Montana; Declaring it to be the Intention of the District to Undertake Certain Local Improvements Consisting of the Design, Construction, and Installation of a Sewage Treatment Plant and Sewer Collection Lines and Associated Improvements and Appurtenances, Some of Which Benefit All of the Property in the District, and to Undertake to Authorize Special Assessments to Finance the Costs Thereof and Incidental Thereto Through the Issuance of Special Assessment Bonds; and Calling for a Public Hearing Thereon" (the "Resolution of Intention"). Special assessments are to be levied in accordance with the Resolution of Intention to secure the repayment of bonds to be issued by the District to pay a portion of the costs of (i) construction and installation of the sewage treatment plant sized to serve all of the properties in the District and surrounding areas and associated appurtenances that benefit all properties in the District, including a force main and lift station (such plant and appurtenances, the "Sewage Treatment Plant"), and (ii) construction and installation of collection lines and a lift station connecting sewer services to properties in Subdistrict No. 1 of the District ("Subdistrict No. 1"), associated rights-of-way and easements, and abandoning existing septic systems in Subdistrict No. 1 (collectively, the "Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements").

The total estimated cost of the Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements and the Sewage Treatment Plant (together, the "Initial Project"), including associated costs of financing, is \$15,654,333. Costs of the Initial Project are expected to be paid by various grants available to the District in an aggregate amount of \$9,796,333 that will benefit the entire District and funds the District has on hand and available therefor in an amount of \$68,000, and the balance of costs would be paid by proceeds of bonds of the District. The bonds of the District are expected to be in three series: the Collection System Bond in the total principal amount of \$1,488,000 to pay a portion of the cost of the collection system serving only Subdistrict No. 1 and the Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds in the total principal amounts of \$3,000,000 and \$1,302,000, respectively, to pay a portion of the cost of the Sewage Treatment Plant.

Each property in Subdistrict No. 1 would be assessed an equal amount based upon the cost of the Subdistrict No. 1 Improvements and costs incidental thereto to be financed by the Collection System Bond, which is estimated to be \$1,488,000. By spreading this estimated cost equally across each property in Subdistrict No. 1, the total principal amount of the assessment per property in Subdistrict No. 1 for the Collection System Bond is estimated to be \$7,153.85. Based on estimated total semiannual payments of assessments due in connection with the Collection System Bond of \$30,796.00, the estimated semiannual payments of assessments per each lot, tract, or parcel in Subdistrict No. 1 would be \$148.06, or \$296.12 per year.

The Sewage Treatment Plant is sized to serve not less than all lots, tracts, and parcels in the District. Each property in the District would be assessed an equal amount based upon the total cost of the Sewage Treatment Plant and costs incidental thereto to be financed by the Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds, which is estimated to total \$4,302,000. By spreading this

estimated cost equally across each property in the District, the total principal amount of the assessment per property in the District is estimated to be \$8,552.69. Based on estimated total semiannual assessments in the District due in connection with the Sewage Treatment Bonds of \$90,724.00, the estimated semiannual payments of assessments per each lot, parcel or tract in the District in connection with the Sewage Treatment Bonds would be \$180.37, or \$360.74 per year.

If an increase occurs in the number of properties within the boundaries of the District during the term of the Bonds, the Board will recalculate the amount assessable to each property based on the Subdistrict in the District in which the increase in the number of properties occurs. The recalculation will be further based on the amount of the outstanding principal of and interest on the Collection System Bond, if applicable, and the Sewage Treatment Plant Bonds for the fiscal year and the District will spread the assessments across the District, and if appropriate, Subdistrict No. 1, based on the number of benefited properties within the boundaries of the District, and if appropriate, Subdistrict No. 1, as of the July 1 following the action that resulted in the increase in the number of properties.

From and after the date of the adoption of the resolution approving the levy of the special assessments, if such resolution is adopted, the lien of the special assessments to pay or finance a portion of the costs of the Initial Project and incidental costs is not extinguished or diminished by the combination or consolidation of multiple properties into fewer properties; accordingly, the area consisting of the combined or consolidated properties will be assessed in an amount equal to the amount it would have been assessed had the combination or consolidation of properties not occurred.

A complete copy of the Resolution of Intention, which includes the proposed assessment for each property in the District, is on file with the Secretary of the District and is available for public inspection.

Any owner of real property within the District subject to assessment for the cost and expense of making the Initial Project may make and file with the Secretary of the District until 5:00 p.m., M.T., December 18, 2017, written protest against the proposed levy of assessments.

Such protest:

- shall be in writing, clearly identify the protestor and the property in the District owned by the protestor (by, for example, property tax identification number or legal description or other means that identifies the property with reasonable clarity), and be signed by all owners of the property;
- shall be either (i) sent by mail to the Secretary of the District, Seeley Lake-Missoula County Sewer District, P.O. Box 403, Seeley Lake, MT 59868, or (ii) delivered in person to the Seeley Lake-Missoula County Water District office located at 281 Rice Ridge Road, in Seeley Lake, Montana; and
- shall be received by the District by not later than 5 p.m. on Monday, December 18, 2017.

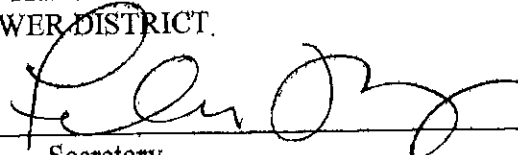
A mailed protest that is received by the District after 5:00 p.m. on December 18, 2017 will not be counted notwithstanding that it is postmarked before December 18, 2017. The Secretary of the District shall endorse on the protest the date and hour of receipt of the protest by him or her.

On Thursday, December 21, 2017, commencing at 5:15 p.m. at the Missoula County Satellite Office, 3360 Hwy 83 N, Seeley Lake, Montana, the Board of Directors will conduct a public hearing and pass upon all valid protests to the proposed levy of the special assessments submitted prior to the conclusion of the protest period. At the election of the Board of Directors, such hearing may be adjourned from day to day.
