



FLOOD RESOURCE FACT SHEET

PREPARING TO EVACUATE

Stay alert. Sign up for Smart 911 alerts (smart911.com) to receive emergency notifications from Missoula County. Stay tuned to your phone alerts, TV, radio or online sources for weather updates, emergency instructions or evacuation orders.

Be prepared to leave. *It is in your best interest to self-evacuate your property before or immediately following an order.* If an order is issued and you choose not to evacuate, authorities cannot guarantee your safety. Once a residence loses power, NorthWestern Energy will not turn it back on until the property is safe again.

Arrange for housing. If possible, make arrangements ahead of time to stay with family or friends in case authorities order evacuations. The American Red Cross has established evacuation shelters in Missoula at Christ the King Church, 1400 Gerald Ave., and in Seeley Lake at the Mission Bible Fellowship, 3158 Highway 83. Residents seeking shelter should call 1-800-272-6668.

Plan for pets and valuables. Animals can be stranded without food and face dangerous waters if left behind when owners evacuate their homes. If you are in an area subject to flooding, make plans for your pets and livestock ahead of time. Missoula Animal Control can help make arrangement for stranded pets and livestock. Call 406-549-3934.

Also plan ahead of time to secure any valuables you do not want to be lost or damaged in a flood.

Prepare an emergency supply kit. Kit should include three days of supplies, three gallons of water, and nine meals — *per person*. Also be sure to stock the kit

with necessary prescription medications, over-the-counter medications, first-aid supplies and important documents. Go to www.ready.gov/build-a-kit for a complete list of recommended items.

Contact your flood insurance agent. Flood insurance is required by most mortgage companies for homes located in flood-prone areas. Contact your insurance company for assistance with clean-up and repairs after a flood. Part of the policy may cover relocating items before and during a flood, and it may also help pay for sand and sandbags to protect your home. Contact your insurance agent for more information on your coverage.
