WMMHC: Winds of Change; 3 Rivers; YWCA; Sunburst MH; NAMI; St. Patrick

911 Dispatch- County
Some CIT; Smart 911/MH flag if LE alerts

Law Enforcement
Missoula Police Dept: 99 sworn officers; 6-8 CIT trained per year (about 48 on most shifts); some Narcan. Homeless Outreach Team (HOT): 3 officers, proactive, can transport to services
Missoula County Sheriff's Dept: 40 sworn officers; about 6 CIT trained per year

Fire/MESI Co-response

WMMHC Response Team
24/7, only respond to jail and Community currently

Crisis Stabilization
WMMHC Recovery Center: dual-diagnosis substance abuse rehab
WMMHC Dakota Place: 5 voluntary beds/2 emergency detention beds; potential LE drop-off; jail step down
Open Aid Alliance: harm reduction; Narcan
Sunburst MH Services: walk-ins Tue-Fri limited hours
Poverello Center: 175-bed emergency shelter; 20-bed Housing Montana Heroes and 17-bed Valor House for veterans

Peer Support Services
Open Aid, Winds of Change, and WMMHC

Partnership Health Center
Non-crisis BH services; satellite clinics at Poverello & WMMHC; superutilizer team

Law Enforcement & Emergency Services

Tele-psych

Hospitals
St. Patrick: 6-bed Psychiatric ICU (adding 8 additional beds); outpatient care; telepsychiatry; SBIRT for substance abuse – integrated BH
Community Medical Center: WMMHC mental health professionals respond 24/7 for evaluations (but no psychiatric services/bed space) – integrated BH

Veteran Services
Fort Harrison VA; Sheridan VA in WY - closest psychiatric unit

Intercept 2

Initial Detention & Initial Court Hearings

Initial Detention at MCDF
Law enforcement MH flag/ observations; suicide/medical/mental health/substance use screen; new Officers receive suicide/MH/self-care training
Housing classification w/in 24 hrs; Brief Jail Mental Health Screen; referral to WMMHC if needed (2 therapists M-F or on-call MHP)
Justice Court uses the PSA, typically prior to first court hearing; court date reminders; Judge sets bail; If requested, additional supplemental pre-trial screen within 10 days

Arrest

Arraignment & Diversion
Teleconference to court from the jail PD is here voluntarily (not appointed yet); address bond; preliminary hearing as placeholder within 14 days; then set next court date in District Court (if released, about a month)
Arraignment at District Court (felony):
Informal Adjustment Diversion: Pre-plea County Attny; low-level first-time. (hiring soon) crimes with case plans; 90-day program; success = dismiss charges; 10 people/year

• SMI- coping skill groups, 1-1, suicide checks/watch; 90 days follow-up case management
1 part-time Licensed Addiction Counselor (LAC) WMMHC (CD Evals)

Reentry

MDOC Reentry
• Pre-Release Facility (MCS)
• Nurse support from FQHC
• Cognitive Skill Training: Moral Recognition Therapy
• Contracted, Conditional Release, Post-convicted felon – M/F Units – 117 beds

Medicaid Enrollment

Jail Reentry
Inmate/Patient has to ask for Medicaid enrollment and ask for medication at release
PFR – working with State on Discharge Plan
Human Resource Council can pay for IDs if needed
Flathead Tribal Defenders: SDMI Reentry Case Manager
Welcome-Back Peers (MIC)
Reentry housing/housing vouchers (grant-funded)

Felonies only- about 30 officers
• Traditional caseload: 80-95 people
• Intensive Sup (2 Officers): 30-50 people
• Mental Health (1 Officer): 65

• Sex Offense (2 Officer): 65
Substance use violations: Enhanced Supervision/Day Reporting, case management. - Crosswinds Sober Living
